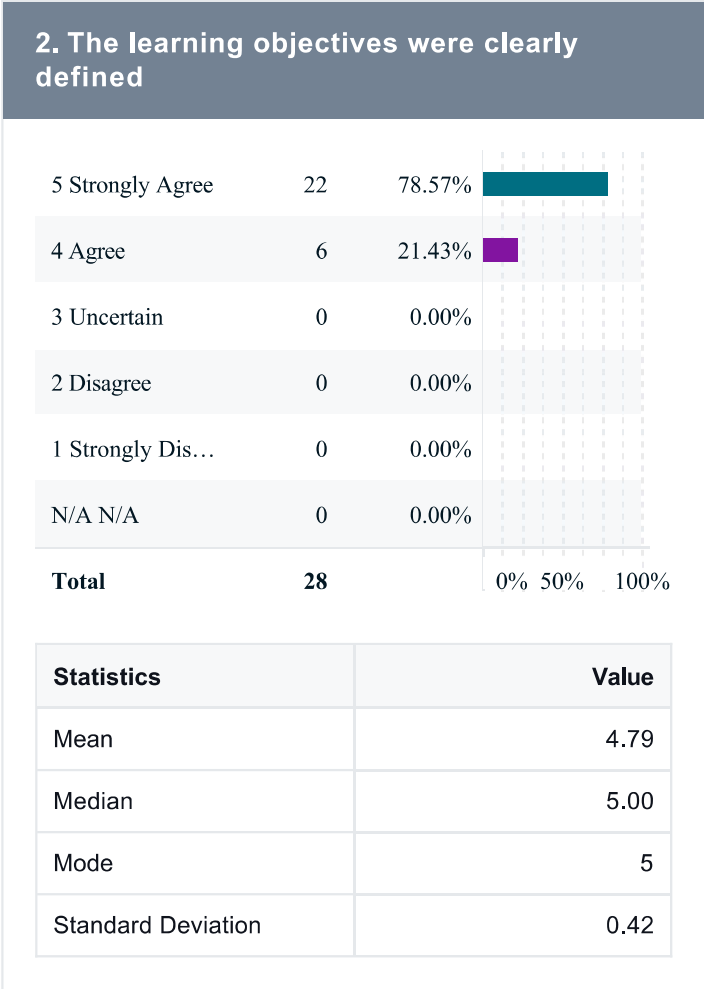
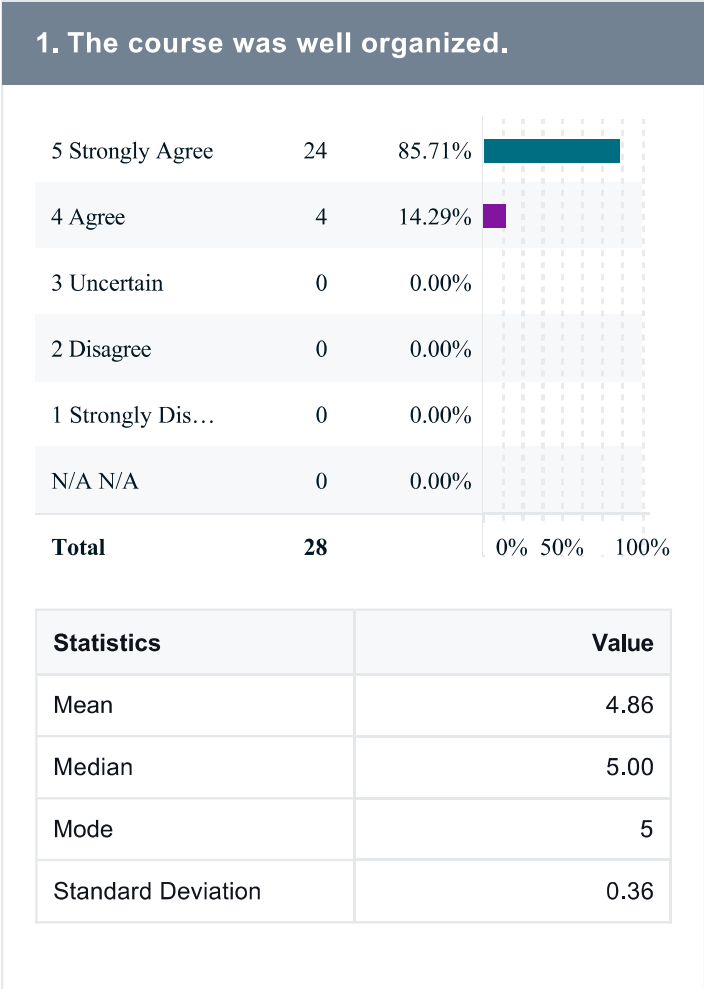

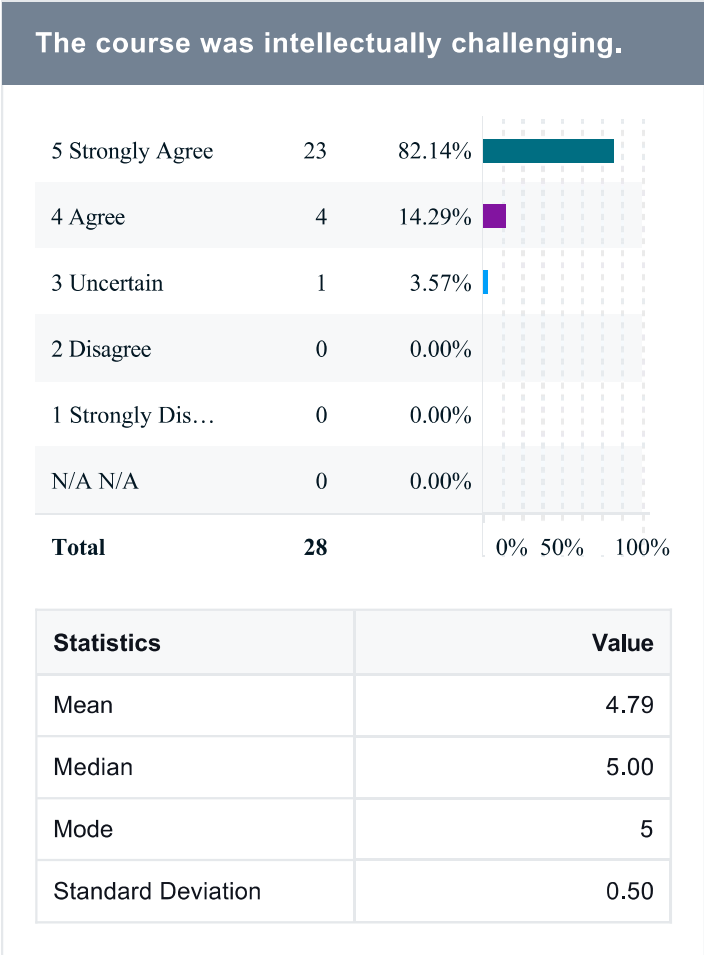
Distribution of Responses



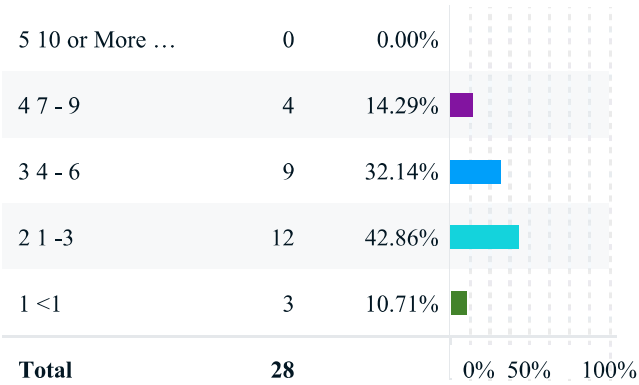

On average, how many hours per week outside of class do you devote for this course?

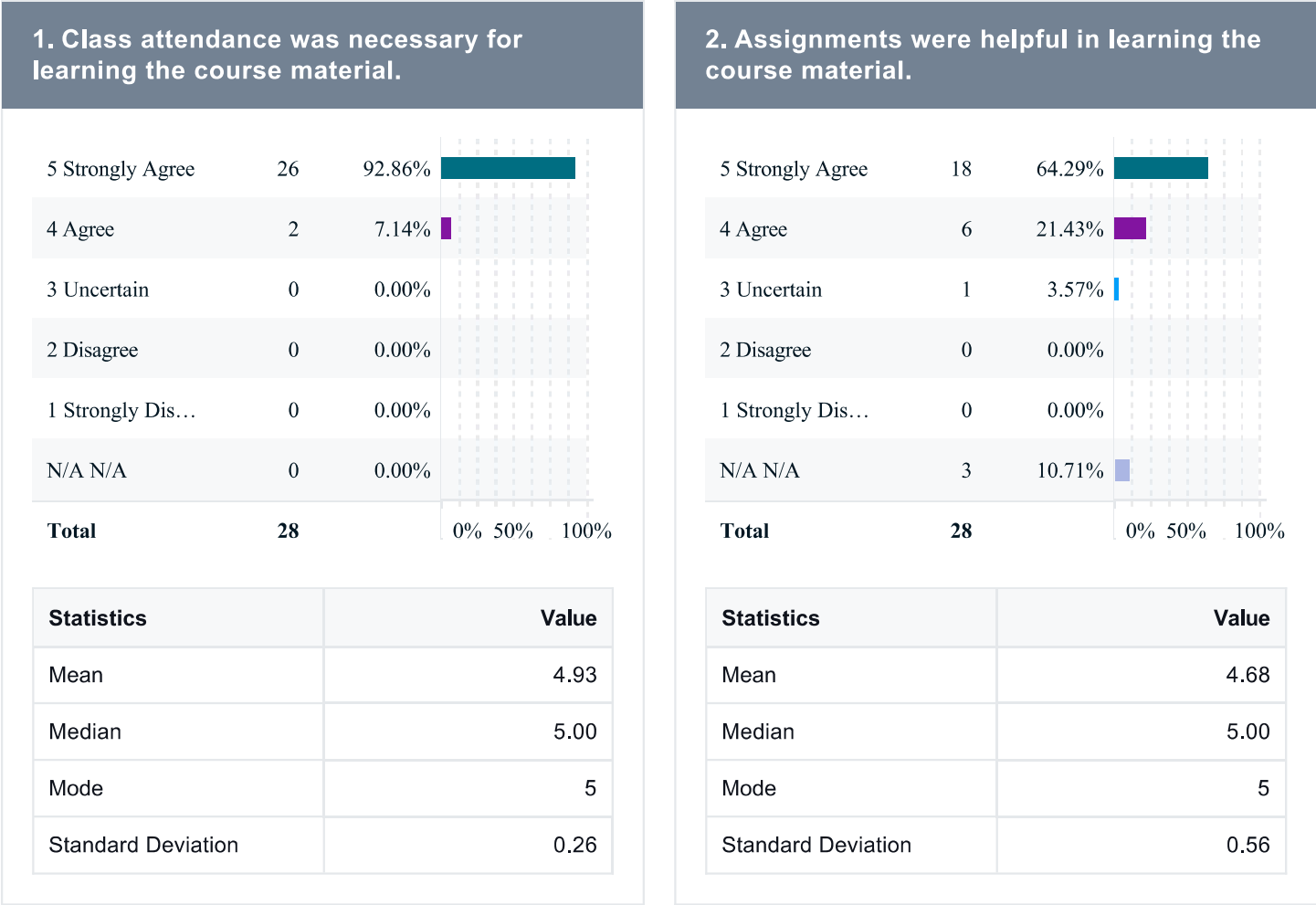


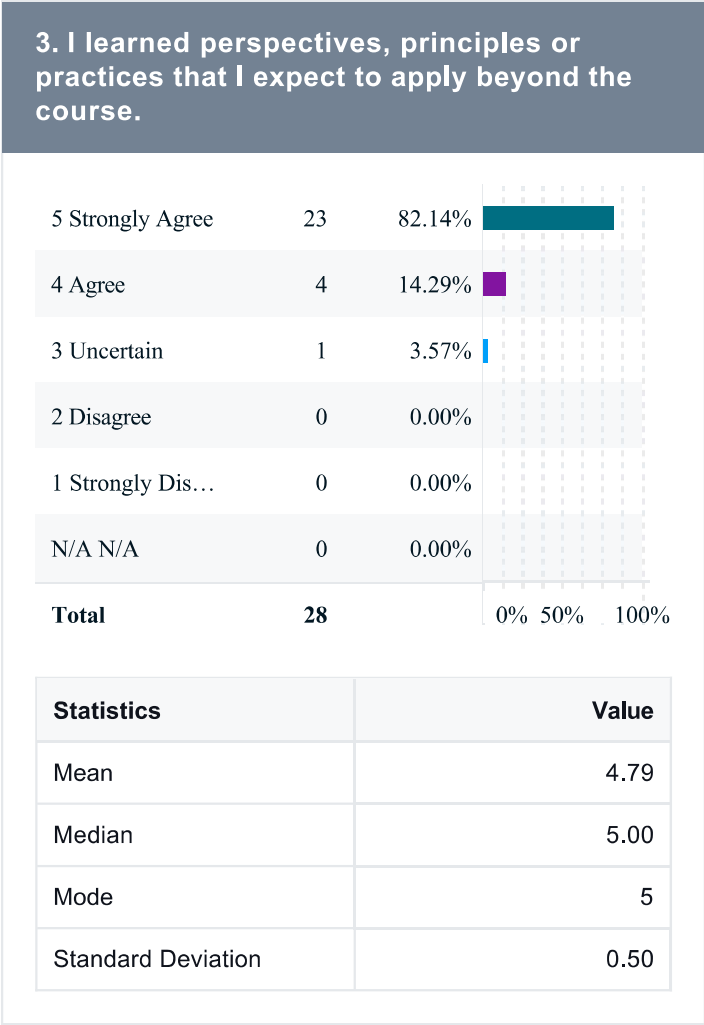

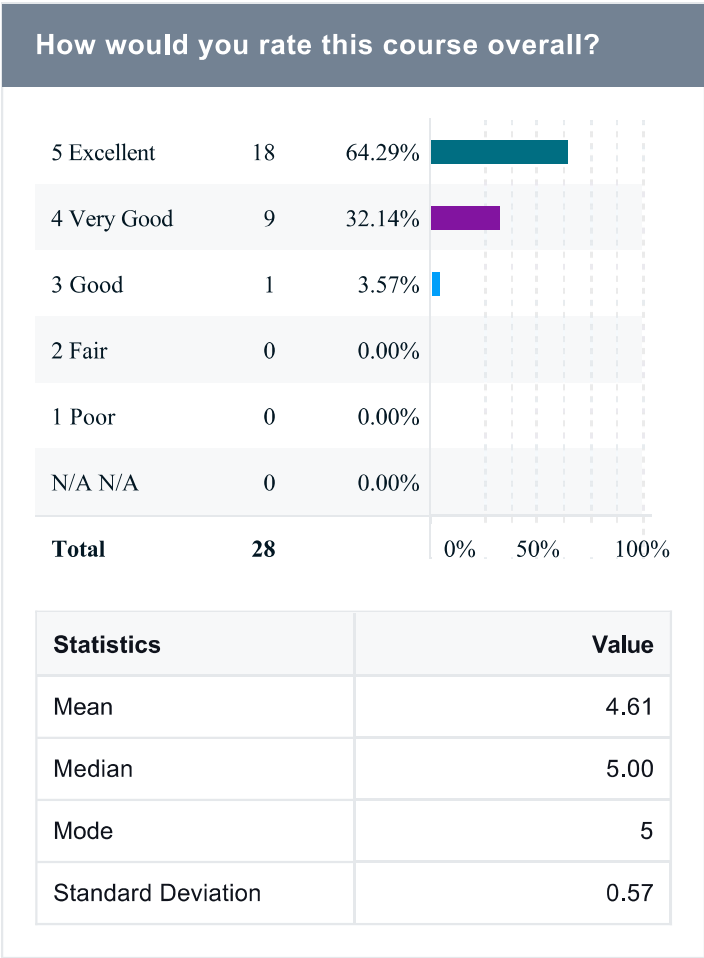

This course is so organized and detailed, very beginner-friendly (even if you have no knowledge on American Grand Strategy, this course teaches you from the foundation and builds up). The course provides just enough historical background combined with analysis from various scholars.

I think professor Byun clearly had an angle. Most of what we learned was through a restraint POV. It would have been nice if he gave the other perspectives more consideration.
I wish there were more participation, not necessarily because undergrads have much insightful to say about American grand strategy, but because I would have done more of the reading. If the reading is going to be strongly implied to be semi-optional, I don't see the point of assigning so much, because I would get overwhelmed and not always do it because it wasn't STRICTLY necessary, and then I would feel bad about myself. I'm not saying there shouldn't be as much assigned reading; it should just be actually required if it's going to be so much. Professor Byun said during I think the first class that there wouldn't be a lot of participation because he doesn't think undergrads know enough to have valuable opinions, and that scared me and almost made me drop the class because I thought he would be disrespectful or I would be bored, but actually he just doesn't have much of a filter. I think it's fine if he wants to say vaguely disparaging things about undergrads; it definitely wouldn't bother me anymore, but he shouldn't say things like that on the first day because people will get the wrong idea.

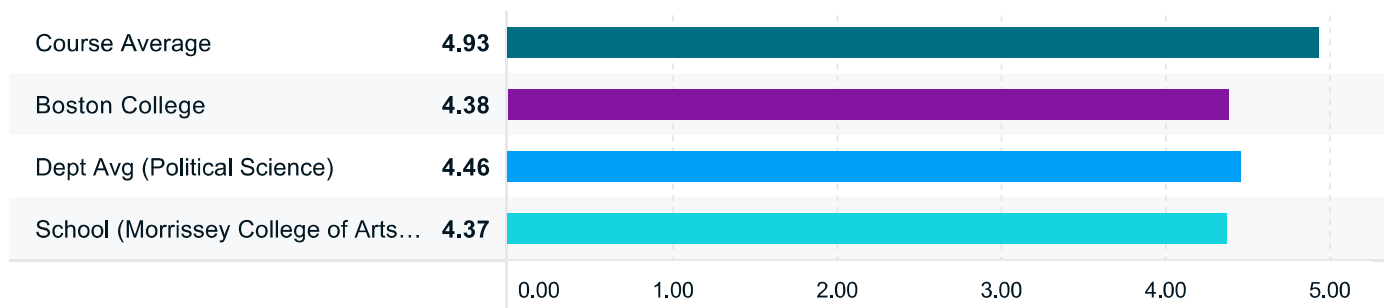


On average, how many hours per week outside of class do you devote for this course?

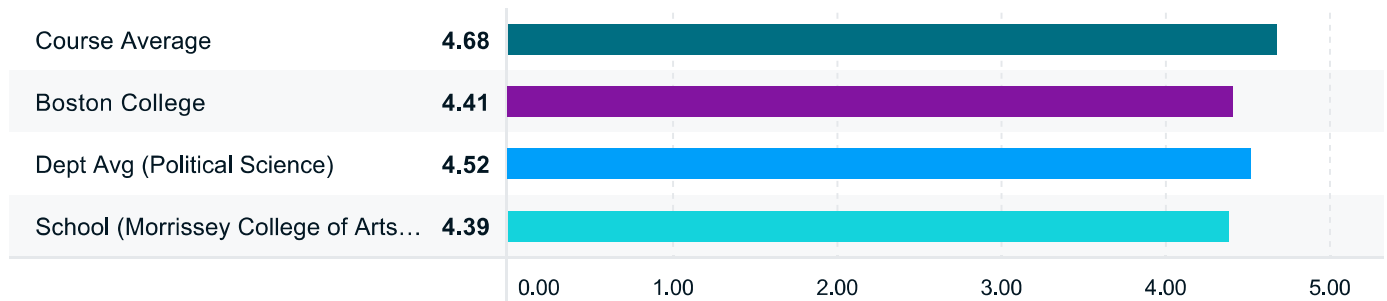
